If you want to register in a chatroom, use a made up name as a nickname, one which gives no indication of who you are. If in doubt, ask your parents or someone you trust. Never reveal your real name, address, school address, telephone number or mobile number in chatrooms or emails.



TIP: Deal with bullying

Protect your computer and by doing so you protect all your important documents and memories: install an antivirus program and a firewall and update them regularly. Check whether there are security updates for the operating system and software and always install them. TIP: Protect your computer

Check whether your wireless network (WLAN) is enrypted. If not, set up encryption using the manual for the device. The encryption tools are WPA2, WPA or WEP (an older standard). You can also get online help from the device manufacturer's support site or via their hotline. Switch the WLAN device off when it is not in use.















